



Our Health Guarantee

The puppy will leave our facility clean, in good general health, and with no physical defects. A veterinarian will examine the puppy before leaving our home and administer the first round of vaccines and will have been wormed if and as recommended by the veterinarian. While it is generally recognized that intestinal parasites and ear mites are common in puppies and part of a puppy's early development, we will make every effort to prevent such parasites. The breeder does not guarantee or warrant that the puppy will be free from worms and parasites. The stress of change and travel can often cause intestinal parasites to emerge after the puppy has left its mother.

The buyer must take the puppy to a Licensed Veterinarian of their choice for the puppy's well check-up within 3 days of delivery. If the puppy is found to have a disease that is untreatable or found to have a hereditary disease, a letter from the Licensed Veterinarian stating the problem must be presented to the breeder within 5 days of delivery. In this case, the puppy will be returned to the Breeder within 7 days, and the buyer will be offered a replacement puppy, if available, or a refund of the purchase price. If the puppy is not taken to a licensed veterinarian within 3 days of receiving the puppy, the health guarantee is void. Transportation of the returned puppy is the responsibility of the buyer. Veterinary and Medical care, and its associated costs are the sole and exclusive responsibility of the Buyer.

The Breeder provides this health guarantee for 2 years from the puppy's date of birth against any debilitating congenital defects. Debilitating congenital defects are defined as those present since birth that are either life-threatening or would prevent the puppy from

fulfilling the intended purpose for which it was purchased. Should this puppy be determined to be suffering from a debilitating congenital defect, the breeder will replace the puppy after receiving notification and written verification has been furnished to the Breeder by a licensed Veterinarian. The breeder determines which puppy will be used as replacement and the wait may be as long as 6-24 months. The breeder reserves the right to have the puppy/dog examined by our veterinarian, acquire DNA testing, or check the microchip to determine the dog or puppy is one of our lineage and health status before issuing a replacement. If the puppy should die from a suspected congenital defect within the 2-year health guarantee an autopsy may be performed at the buyer's expense by a licensed veterinarian. If the autopsy shows a congenital defect as the reason for the death of the puppy the breeder will provide another puppy of equal value to the buyer. Documentation from the veterinarian must be provided. The health

guarantee is void in the event of an inconclusive diagnosis. If the dog is euthanized or in any way disposed of without a second opinion from the Breeder's Veterinarian, the Buyer waives all rights to a replacement puppy. This health guarantee does NOT cover seizures, allergies, undescended testicles, umbilical hernia, inverted vulvas, improper bites, viral illnesses (such as parvo), malocclusion, autoimmune disorders, and hypoglycemia. It also does not include any illness due to ingestion of foreign objects, food, or chemicals, or physical injury. Seller will NOT replace a puppy due to heat stroke, abuse/neglect, or improper socialization.

***Under no circumstances will the seller be responsible for any veterinary bills, medication, or other expenses incurred by the buyer after the purchase of the puppy. When the puppy leaves the care of the breeder, it becomes the sole responsibility of the buyer. ***

Buyer agrees that they have thoroughly researched the Goldendoodle breed and understand any potential health issues they can possess. Buyer also acknowledges and understands that hair coat color and coat

type for Goldendoodles is not guaranteed and can change throughout the years. Under no circumstances is Buyer entitled to any remedy due to any cosmetic change in the dog. This guarantee covers only the original buyer and is not transferable. New owners agree to keep their puppy at home and away from other dogs, public places, and parks and will use care in allowing others from outside their home to pet or touch the puppy. This is to protect the puppy from exposure to parvovirus and other infectious illnesses. The buyer understands that there is no guarantee or promise that the puppy will be non-shedding and/or hypoallergenic. Of course, that is our desire, and we try to breed for this quality, but there is always a possibility that a dog may shed. Sometimes a person is allergic to the dog's saliva or some environmental trigger, if so; a Goldendoodle may still trigger allergies. Colors, coat types, and sizes at maturity cannot be guaranteed.
